### SATURDAY MORNING MUSIC CLASSES

Groupformat class fees range from \$45 to \$110 per term (8 lessons in Term Two) depending on student age and the instrument chosen. One-to-one classes can aid in preparing for exams and earning NCEA credits. Class times are between 8am and 2pm on Saturdays during primary school terms.
