We had a very successful open day last week with over 180 students, and their families, visiting our College to learn more about life at Sacred Heart. Enrolments for 2020 are open and we have further opportunities for potential students to meet the Principal and tour the school when Catherine Gunn has returned, as well as to attend our 'Experience Sacred Heart' days, later in the year.

At the beginning of the term, Constable Pete, our School Community Officer from NZ Police, delivered a CyberSafety presentation to all our students in year level assemblies. His presentation covered important issues for teenagers today, such as how to keep themselves safe on social media and the impacts of cyberbullying. We often hear from parents that providing support for their daughter in staying safe online is challenging - Netsafe (www.netsafe.org.nz) is a fantastic resource for information and has a section dedicated to parents that I would encourage you to take the time to explore.

Once again, NCEA has been in the media, with the Minister of Education announcing a package of seven changes to NCEA earlier this week. There are several key themes emerging from the change package released that centre around making NCEA more accessible and equitable, and to simplify the structure of the system, with changes to the achievement standards to address workload issues for both students and teachers. The final change package and a design and implementation plan for these is scheduled to be presented to Government Cabinet in November of this year. What we do know it is likely that the implementation process will begin in 2020, and will be rolled out over a number of years with time to draft, trial and revise proposed changes to assessment. As further information comes to us about this plan, we will be sure to share this with our community.

I hope that all of our Mums (in whatever way, shape or form that looks within your whanau) were treated to a Happy Mother's Day last weekend.

NCEA OVERHAUL and NCEA Fees

On Monday 13 May, the proposed changes to NCEA were released by the government. Full details of these changes are in the following document. Link: 2019 NCEA Change Package One part of this package which takes effect 2019 is that domestic students will no longer be charged fees for participating in NCEA and New Zealand Scholarship. If you have already paid fees for NCEA these will be credited to your account. International Students will still be required to pay fees and these will be charged in the usual manner.
